Since 2008, Jermine has worked as one of the original trainers for Mental Health First Aid USA. Originally from Kansas City, Missouri, he moved to St. Louis, Missouri in 2012 to assume the role of Project Director of Mental Health First Aid at the Missouri Institute of Mental Health at the University of Missouri St. Louis (MIMH). He is a national trainer for Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) and has also helped developed the adult and youth curriculums.



In July 2015, he took a leap of faith and started SALT Initiative, a consulting firm which was founded on the principles that service, affirmation and love can bring transformation in the lives of individuals, neighborhoods, faith-based organizations, ministries, nonprofit organizations, colleges/universities and government agencies.
